Was designated in 2001 and exhibited the highest scenic rating of any state byway in Iowa.



Is an ideal loop for visitors traveling the Great River Road as the byway connects along two segments; once in Harpers Ferry and again in Lansing.

Passes public lands and parks that offer seasonal opportunities for hiking, canoeing, camping, fishing, birding and cycling.
